Anjana's Struggle for Gender Equality



PANEER CLUB SANDWICH

Ingredients:

- 75-100g of Paneer
- Hot sauce
- ½ Tomato & 1/4 Cucumber
- Mayonnaise
- 3 Breads
- Salt and pepper to taste



Instructions:

- 1. Take 75 100g of Paneer with some hot sauce to your taste. Sauté it and keep it aside
- 2. Cut up some thin slices of tomato and cucumber
- 3. Take some mayonnaise, hot sauce and mix it in a 2:1 ratio until you get a light orange colour. If you want to reduce the spice, you can also add some honey.
- 4. Take 3 slices of bread and spread the spread made above on the sides of the bread.
- 5. For the first layer add sauted paneer and for the second layer decorate it with tomato and cucumber slices
- 6. Grill it over a frying pan and serve it with any condiment on the side.


Vegan Chocolate Cake

November 1st is World Vegan Day. Let us make a delicious vegan chocolate cake.

This cake is easy to make. All you need is

- 1. 1½ cups all-purpose flour
- 2. ½ cup powdered sugar
- 3. ½ cup cocoa powder
- 4. 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 5. ½ teaspoon salt
- 6. 1 cup water
- 7. ½ cup vegetable oil
- 8. ½ teaspoon vanilla extract
- 9. 1 teaspoon white vinegar





To make this cake you must follow 5 easy steps.

- 1. Preheat your oven to 360°F or 175°C
- 2. Mix all the dry ingredients- all-purpose flour, powdered sugar, cocoa powder, baking soda and salt.
- 3. Add water, vegetable oil, vinegar and vanilla extract. Mix until smooth
- 4. Pour the mixture into a cake pan greased with vegetable oil.
- 5. Bake for 45-60 minutes.
